Walberswick Local History Group Bloody Marsh, a talk by Dr Peter Warner Saturday, 14 March

6pm in the Village Hall. In April 1644, a steward employed by the lord of the manor died in an altercation with Walberswick villagers over grazing rights and three men were later hanged for his murder. The disputed area, to the south of Westwood Lodge, gained the name Bloody Marsh. There were many conflicts about the enclosure of common land around Walberswick and there is no better guide to this subject than Dr Peter Warner, Emeritus Fellow of Homerton College, Cambridge.

The talk will begin at 6pm, earlier than usual. Afterwards there will be a chance to chat over a glass of wine. Free for members, £5 for non-members. **Edward Wright**

Urgent review sought for major energy projects in Suffolk

Walberswick is one of 32 local communities that have joined forces to oppose moves to build seven major energy projects in the county. The local councils have jointly written to the Secretary for State for Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy, asking the government urgently to review the impact of the proposed plans on local communities and the cumulative impact on the county. The projects include Sizewell C, the 30-acre substation at Friston, new windfarms and the expansion of existing windfarms, as well as plans for new cables across the North Sea and into the county.
