# Walberswick Local History Group Bloody Marsh, a talk by Dr Peter Warner Saturday, 14 March

In April 1644, a steward employed by the lord of the manor died in an altercation with Walberswick villagers over grazing rights and three men were later hanged for his murder. The disputed area, to the south of Westwood Lodge, gained the name Bloody Marsh. There were many conflicts about the enclosure of common land around Walberswick and there is no better guide to this subject than Dr Peter Warner, Emeritus Fellow of Homerton College, Cambridge.
