The village has lost one of its great characters, Nigel Hunt 1947-2021

Jimmy Wigdahl (1926 - 2021)

Sadly, Dad passed away on 16 January aged 94, and with him went an encyclopaedic knowledge of Walberswick. An only son, he moved here, aged seven, in 1933 with his parents Hal & Amy. They bought the then Old Vicarage and ran it as a 12-bedroom hotel, with three grass tennis courts and mini putting course. He spent his time with friends on the old railway, pushing abandoned trucks and playing in the ticket office.

His wartime recollections were amazing – including the Old Vicarage being bombed in 1941 effectively condemning the hotel. Out of the ashes came Marsh End, built by my grandfather after the war, when Dad returned from active service in the Med. The family then decamped to Old Vicarage Cottage until Hal died in 1962.

Dad read medicine at Oxford/Middlesex Hospital and in 1956 met Mum, daughter of Frank & Molly Holl at Jove cottage. They married in St Andrew's in 1959, and from that came yours truly, the third (& fourth) generations in the village. He will be greatly missed. **Ollie Wigdahl**

Environmental Stewardship

You may have seen the new planting in Sandy Lane, Bennett's Copse and Bennett's Drift. Walberswick Common Lands Charity has recently planted some 800 mixed variety hedge whips as well as oak, wild plum, crab apple, rowan, field maple, Scots pine and beech trees.

The Charity would like to carry out some wildlife surveys on the Common, grazing marshes and elsewhere, especially of dragonflies and water voles as well as of heathland birds, reptiles and butterflies. The aim is to record and monitor wildlife in a repeatable way to assist the Charity with its ongoing environmental stewardship work. Major Reduction in Precept for 2021/22

At its meetings in November and December 2020, the Parish Council considered necessary expenditures, approved an annual budget, and set a precept for 2021/22. We are very happy to announce that the precept for the coming year has been set at £20,000 which is a decrease of 20% from the precept in 2020/21.

If we look back to 2019/20, this year's precept represents a drop of 26% over two fiscal years. The Council is proud of this accomplishment as it represents a return, after a decade of turmoil, to a 'steady state' precept where the annual amount raised is basically equal to the amount of annual expenditures, while rebuilding and holding a responsible reserve equal to some six to nine months of expenditures. Our Council finances are now wholly aligned with financial best practice guidelines of the National Association of Local Government (NALC).

This year's budget also represents the clearance of the external audit bill of £14,000 from 2017/18 that was caused by the actions of a few individuals, who lodged over one hundred groundless objections to the annual audit, none of which were upheld, but allowed the external auditor to charge the Council for the time it spent reviewing these objections. We have had no such objections since then meaning that, for the past two years, our annual external audit expenses have been at the nationally mandated amount of £240.

The massive reduction in audit costs, careful management of expenses, and the development and roll out of the up-to-date financial and governance policies that have helped guide the Council's actions, have all contributed to the ability to bring the precept down. We are also extremely grateful for the receipt, through our East Suffolk District Councillor, David Beavan, of several generous grants that have supported the replacement and improvement of the play equipment on the Green and playing fields. The Council is particularly glad to have reached this stage now as other Council taxes are set to rise as the County reacts to the extraordinary costs of social care and other expenses associated with Covid-19.

The precept tax per household will be reflected in the 2021/22 Council tax bill normally received in March. **Josie Bassinette, Chairman**

Repairs to St Andrew's

St Andrews remains closed at present until the repair works are complete, hopefully by the end of February. The PCC apologises for the overrun of the works, but the scaffolding should be removed in the next fortnight, weather permitting. The delay is caused by the arrival of the new oak doors to the turret and, once they are fitted and surrounding flint works completed, it will be removed.

Drainage and puddling works on the path by the entrance will begin shortly, and once the weather warms up, the contractors can apply limewash in the restored porch. You will all be welcome to admire the restored benches and floor very soon.
