The Heritage Hut and The Scroll - both refurbished

While you will undoubtedly have seen the newly decorated and refurbished exterior of the Heritage Hut, the 'home of the scroll' needs to be seen from the inside as well. More than that, you will want to see the brilliantly refurbished scroll casing. Our most sincere thanks go to Jill Whittenbury for funding the whole project, and to Clive Jackson for giving us his time and expertise. The photo shows Jill Whittenbury viewing the refurbished case recently. Probably you cannot read the plaque on the case which states "The scroll was painted by John Doman Turner 1931-1932. It is the property of Walberswick Parish Council, which owes gratitude to its long term keeper Richard Scott (1938-2020) and to Tony Whittenbury (1929-2008) who devised and made the display mechanism".

At this time, we will also want to remember particularly Richard Scott, who died last year, and will surely be present in our mind's eye as we show the scroll and repeat some of his stories.

It has been a long time coming but both the Heritage Hut and the Walberswick Scroll will be on display the weekend of the **26 and 27 June**. John English will be turning the handle and telling the Walberswick story. Hopefully the restrictions will be minimal by then but we are planning to make this a 'ticket' event to control numbers. Book early to secure your place, first come first served. It is free but all donations gratefully received. These will go to the Heritage Hut/scroll fund.

Showings on the Saturday and Sunday will be at 10am, 11am and 12 noon. We will limit showings to five people. Walk-ins will be permitted if showings are not fully booked, or in the case of people not turning up.

Parish Council News

At the Annual Parish Council meeting held on 5 May, **Andrew Lewis was elected as the new Chair** following Josie Bassinette stepping down upon the expiration of the maximum three-year term in that office. Councillors extended their warmest thanks to her for all her hard work in leading the Council. She was then elected Vice Chair.

Bailey Bridge Update

It is now official — the Bailey Bridge will close sometime towards late June through September. Sadly, this is unavoidable given the very poor state of the bridge and the inability of Suffolk Highways to put off the essential repairs. In short, even if the work they need to do to renovate the bridge could be done in the autumn, the state of the bridge is such that it would still have to be shut over the summer on safety grounds.

This reality redoubles the importance of getting mitigation measures in place to avoid the hugely negative impact the closure will have on our local businesses, families, and visitors. Some measures have been agreed and others are still being sorted. Walberswick Parish Council will continue to take part in weekly meetings of our mitigation group with Suffolk Highways to get the best it can from Suffolk County Council (SCC) to support Walberswick. At present, these mitigation measures are:

- Our ferry operator will run a much greater capacity service, including a second, larger capacity crossing near to
 the current ferry. As reported previously, we had hoped to run this second service from a pontoon nearer to the
 Bailey Bridge, but this was unfeasible given limited access on the Walberswick side. It is hoped that the service
 will be able to run from early in the morning to evening. A key issue is to make this service more affordable with a
 subsidy provided by SCC. Discussions are ongoing and we hope to have a resolution very soon so that final
 arrangements can be made.
- Suffolk Highways and Footpaths are working with the Ferry Operator and the Walberswick Common Lands Charity (WCLC) to temporarily improve the access to the second ferry landing that crossed WCLC land adjacent to the current ferry pontoon. Likewise, improvements are being made to the Southwold side.
- Suffolk Highways has agreed, on an emergency basis, to put in extra yellow lines to control on-street parking and dangerous conditions near the Church and around the Village Hall. This will be necessary given the expected presence of even more cars than last summer given the inability of visitors to walk and cycle across the bridge.

Villagers will see public notice signs going up shortly about the pending closure. Suffolk Highways has committed to keeping the bridge open until they are ready to begin works, likely in the third or fourth week of June. They will use their engineering teams to make weekly site inspections of the bridge to ensure that there is no further serious deterioration in its condition between now and then.

Further updates will be posted on the Walberswick Village website given that closure is likely prior to the next edition of the Village News. On the positive, the renovation will be comprehensive and should ensure that our bridge is good for many, many decades to come.

Next Parish Council Meeting

To comply with current Covid restrictions, this will now take place on the new date of Tuesday, 22 June, at 7pm. Assuming that the government continues with its planned lifting of social distancing restrictions on 21 June, it will be held in the Heritage Hut and open to members of the public who may either choose to attend in person or can still join remotely. Walberswick Birds - May 2021

Although there has been no 'official' bird song walk this year, I have been out several times on the route. Two Common Cranes flew over the Dingles and three Ring Ouzels were on the Playing Field, both sightings at end of April. Then Monday, 10 May, was a particularly good day, although wet to start, it brightened up. Cuckoos were calling in the distance during all of the walk, which mingled with Bitterns booming (three separate sightings in flight), at least three Nightingales, and a Hobby, despite being a flypast its facial markings were very clear. We also had good numbers of Swifts, Marsh Harriers and Avocets on the shore pools. Another day, a Grasshopper Warbler gave excellent views. **Pat Lancaster**

New Sole Bay Community Bus service

The new Sole Bay Community Bus, known as Mr Bus and operated by the Voluntary Help Centre, Sole Bay Care Fund and Halesworth Area Community Transport, will be visiting Walberswick on Mondays and Thursday throughout the summer (1 May - 30 September). You can pick it up at The Harbour Car Park at 9.15am. It returns to the village arriving at around 1.05pm. Please check with the bus driver as to where you can pick the bus up in Southwold for the return journey.

The bus can be hailed anywhere on route and there are numerous stops on the way to, and in and around Southwold, all listed in the timetables available from the Tuck Shop. You can also ask the driver to stop the bus just about anywhere along the route.

The cost is £2 each way for adults, free if you have a bus pass, 50p for children up to 16 years, and free for children under five years. Face coverings must be worn. **Editor**
