

Marian Beard 1945-2021

Marian Beard passed away on 2 July and a memorial service was held for her in St Andrew's Church, Walberswick, on 20 July.

Marian had lived in the village for eleven years and described it as "my idea of paradise". She was a keen gardener and competitor in the annual village horticultural show, winning the Harvey Memorial trophy seven times, as well as producing prize-winning dahlias.

Life here suited her tremendously and she threw herself into many different activities, including costume designing for the village plays. Probably the greatest mark she made was as President of the village WI. In that role, she brought her unique enthusiasm to the monthly meetings and outings. She also led the programme of bulb and flower planting on the greens opposite the church and at the end of Stocks Lane.



She made friends easily in Walberswick, many of whom attended the service and she will be sorely missed by them and family alike.

The family wishes to thank all those who came to pay their respects, and in particular to thank them for their generosity, which resulted in a collection of over £4,000 for the Sole Bay Care Fund. **The Beard Family**

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Parish Council News

Bailey Bridge update - financial support

As we are all aware, the Bailey Bridge is closed for essential renovation until the end of September. To help mitigate the impact, Suffolk County Council has made financing available to help local people where the temporary closure has disrupted their ability to walk or cycle between Southwold/Reydon and Walberswick for the purposes of work, caring, childcare, education, medical and/or pastoral care, and family well-being. It can also be used to help local businesses with employees who would normally have used the bridge to get to work. Other special needs of individuals or businesses can be considered on a case-by-case basis. The support is temporary and limited by available funds and overall demand. In most cases, the support is through provision of a non-transferable ferry pass with a defined number of crossings. Support for taxi or other transport costs is also possible depending on specific need. The assistance is administered locally by Council representatives from Walberswick, Southwold and the County.

Please include your name, a short explanation of need and contact details. All requests will be dealt with in no longer than a week and often more quickly.

Sizewell C update - the environment

The process for deciding on Sizewell C is in full swing with the Planning Inspectorate, which has been given only six months from start to finish to make a recommendation to the Secretary of State, a harrowing timeline for something with such overwhelming environmental, community and transport issues. For those who are registered as Interested Parties, including the Walberswick Parish Council, it can be a monumental task to take part. One of the things that became clear in attending these hearings was how much devastation this development will cause to the Sizewell, Minsmere and Walberswick marshes, to the Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty and the SSSI and the risks it poses to the survival of the area's biodiversity and fish stocks off our coast. The bottom line is that Sizewell C is nothing like Sizewell A or B. It is massively bigger and will cause far more damage. EDF does not have sufficient land on which to build these two new gigantic reactors and therefore will require the taking of portions of the Sizewell marshes, the protected SSSI and AONB and, for its 'associated developments', woodland and agricultural land all the way to the other side of A12 as far as Wickham Market, Westleton and Darsham. One of the many casualties will be the Marsh Harriers. EDF argues that it is acceptable that these birds, saved from extinction in the UK in RSPB Minsmere, should now be displaced from their marshes by the building of Sizewell C.

There is still every possibility to stop Sizewell C but it will require large scale active engagement. The Walberswick Parish Council will regularly post updates and information learned from taking part in the Inspection Process on the Village website. Update on footpaths and grass cutting

The Council is also grateful to Andrew Blois for helping to get the football pitches and Green cut. Norse finally arrived as well last week to finish the job.

As usual, the Council takes an annual break and does not meet in August. Assuming there is no change in the current Covid-19 regulations, the next meeting will be held on Monday, 13 September. Details to follow in next issue.
