

Heather Hyne 1928-2021

Heather was born in Ryde on the Isle of Wight and moved to London to work as an almoner where she met and married Reggie in 1951. She worked with Reggie in their Windsor-based architecture firm for many years. They bought The Hut on the Lea in 1961 and then retired to House on the Green in 1978. Keen ceramic collectors, they were founder members of the Suffolk Crafts Society, establishing the annual Suffolk Crafts Exhibition in Aldeburgh in 1979 and supporting many Suffolk artists. They were very active in the village, including being central to discussions that enabled the village shop to remain open when it was taken over in 1998. Heather moved into care near her daughter in 2014. Many friends and family have happy memories of treasure hunts, pottery sessions and generous hospitality at House on the Green. Heather's funeral will be held at 11am on 6 December at St Andrews Church, Walberswick. **Denise Brentnall**

Update from the bus shelter

Community Speed Watch aims to raise awareness and improve speed limit compliance in the village for the safety of all our road users. Since the spring, we have regularly been out with our speed-gun. On average we catch 10 speeders each session. A third of these have been travelling over 30mph with a handful travelling at more than twice the 20mph limit.

Our aim is to get out for an hour every 10 days, and we have to be a team of at least three. Though sometimes difficult to sustain, we still manage to do this once a fortnight. Parish Council News



A vacancy for a Trustee of the Walberswick Common Lands Charity (WCLC)

Demise of the Pavilion and Pirate Ships

The Pavilion will be open for one last time for anybody who would like to give a home to anything left in it from 12 noon to 3pm on Saturday, 11 December. Demolition will take place the week beginning 13 December and, sadly, the now dangerous Pirate Ships, which significantly failed their recent H&S inspection, will also be removed. The Parish Council has already begun looking at options for the replacement of the Pirate Ships, funds permitting.

Lowestoft Food Bank & Walberswick Food Aid

Every week, volunteers from Walberswick collect donations left in the village Co-op for the food bank, delivering them to a warehouse in Lowestoft for sorting. Boxes (there are four sizes: single person, a couple, small family, and large family) are packed, each containing three days' worth of food.

The Lowestoft food bank covers every town and village east of the A12, down to Saxmundham. Nine and a half thousand people were fed by them in 2020, a number likely to have been exceeded in 2021. The winter months create additional demand as the costs of heating rise, leaving less in domestic budgets for food.

Sam Porter, who manages the food bank, describes it as a sticking plaster: "But it helps people get out of a crisis for a few weeks." Longer-term dependency is not encouraged. Vouchers are issued by referral agencies, such as social services, schools, or for people leaving hospital or prison, and these are exchanged for food boxes.

Sam says that it's amazing how generous people are, not only with food donations but with their time as volunteers and, importantly, cash: "We can run out of things and cash means we can get exactly what we need."
