### **TRAFFIC & PARKING REVIEW**

# FUTURE FLYING MISSIONS... ....WALBERSWICK HISTORY SOCIETY VISIT TO BENTWATERS COLD WAR MUSEUM

To mark the Centenary of the Royal Air Force, the Walberswick Local History Group has arranged a visit to the Bentwater's Cold War Museum, near Woodbridge, on Sunday, 17 June 2018, leaving Walberswick at 0900 hrs. The museum records the airfield's use by the RAF during WW2, and by the USAF throughout the Cold War, displaying RAF and USAF aircraft and weapons, models, uniforms and artefacts, within and around a unique, fully equipped Combat Operations Centre, the only one open to the public in the UK. Subject to other activity on the day, there may be a tour of the huge airfield, some aircraft restoration projects and a Hardened Aircraft Shelter. ### **LETTER FROM THE OLM (retired)**

I guess by the time the current copy of Village News drops through your letter or post box, Easter will be nearly upon us. I wonder what thoughts would be in your mind when Easter is mentioned? Easter eggs, Easter bunnies, Easter egg hunts? Or will you give a moment's thought to the fact that Easter is the major Christian festival?

To jog your memory as to what the festival is really about, I would like to quote below words written by a Dutch Catholic priest, Henri Nouwen, the kind of thoughts that have been much in my mind in recent weeks whilst preparing to preside at funeral and thanksgiving services, of friends, in the village.

"The friends of Jesus saw him and heard him only a few times after that Easter morning, but their lives were completely changed. What seemed to be the end, proved to be the beginning; what seemed to be a cause for fear, proved to be a cause for courage; what seemed to be defeat, proved to be victory; and what seemed to be the basis for despair, proved to be the basis for hope. Suddenly, a wall becomes a gate, and although we are not able to say with much clarity or precision what lies beyond the gate, the tone of all that we do and say, on our way to the gate, changes drastically"

Perhaps I should have called the above, Thought for Easter! I hope that you will enjoy a happy Easter and that you will give some thought to what this period of our Christian faith is really all about
