New payment system to be introduced at the car parks

Walberswick Car Parks Limited (WCPL) is introducing an improvement to its payment systems. As some of you know, we have been struggling with the reliability of the card function on the pay and display machines, despite valiant efforts by our Operations Manager, her team, and the manufacturer. These problems are driven primarily by increasing signal problems with the machines and some technological obsolescence as parking payment systems increasingly move online. After careful research, and to address these problems, we have decided to introduce the online payment app RingGo.

RingGo is a well-known app that many of our customers will already have on their phones; it is used at Southwold Harbour, Halesworth and widely across East Suffolk. If visitors don't have the app, they will be able to download it quite easily the first time they park with us. It is easy, secure and good value for WCPL. We would like to offer our visitors more than one payment option, so for those who prefer to pay with cash, we will continue to operate one pay and display machine in each carpark.

It is our hope that RingGo will be up and running during the first week of July. There will be RingGo signs in both car parks near the pay and display machines, alerting customers to the new payment option. We hope these changes will help improve the visitor experience at our car parks and allow us to continue to generate reliably income for Walberswick Common Lands Charity.

Walberswick Common Lands Charity

Sluices

Walberswick Common Lands Charity (WCLC) is working with partners on two sluices that control water drainage from very different areas. Firstly, the sluice near the Bailey Bridge, which controls the level of water in the dykes and which can be seen from the Bird Hide, became stuck and allowed high tide sea water to flow into the dykes. You may have noticed that Farmer Mark Mayhew had to remove the cattle as their drinking water became saline. The Environment Agency used specialised equipment to explore the problem and retrieved a sailing dingy trolley. It was lodged in the mouth of the sluice, covered in silt and the most enormous rock oysters. All well now.

The second sluice controls the water level in the reedbeds, on the footbridge near the disused windmill. WCLC is replacing it in July, working with the Inland Drainage Board. A GPS survey has been completed to check out the lie of the land. More on this next month.

Spong Bridge repairs

Suffolk Highways will be undertaking much needed and long delayed repairs to the Spong Bridge, sometimes referred to as the Otter Bridge or the Dunwich River Bridge, the southernmost bridge that connects the marsh footpath to the beach south of the caravan park. Unfortunately, this will require the closure of the bridge from 14 August as the rotted and corroded timbers under the bridge deck need replacing. The work should be completed within three to six weeks. Suffolk Highways contractors will be cutting the footpaths around the fields and marshes in the first half of July to ensure alternative routes are clear. They will also be inspecting and replacing broken planks in our boardwalks before the bridge closure.

Parish Council Internal Audit

Walberswick Parish Council (WPC) is delighted to have received another excellent annual report from our internal auditors (the Suffolk Association of Local Councils) and there were no required changes to the way we operate, just two small comments about how good practice could be further enhanced following new legislation introduced in the last year, which WPC has already resolved to adopt immediately. There were also a number of comments praising the existing good practices of WPC on areas such as budget setting.

Public Inspection of Accounts

The next step in the annual financial cycle of the WPC is the Public Inspection of Accounts, which this year will take place from Monday, 26 June until Friday, 4 August and is an opportunity for any member of the public to inspect any aspect of the council's accounts, including all receipts and expenditure. These documents will be made available on reasonable notice by application to the Parish Clerk via email at walberswickclerk@gmail.com. The Notice of Public Rights along with the Summary of Public Rights, the Accounting Statements, the AGAR Annual Internal Audit Report and the Annual Governance Statement can be all be viewed on the WPC noticeboards and online at tinyurl.com/mtjpsy7k.

The Westwood Marsh Mill

A striking landmark on Westwood Marshes, this mill was built in 1798 and worked as a combined drainage and corn grinding mill. The drainage was achieved through a simple wheel, which scooped the water over a raised weir of about 12 inches; the water was then channelled through the marsh wall (Mill Wall) and a sluice out into what became the 'New Dunwich River'.

At the outbreak of WWII the marshes were flooded by blowing up the junction of the Mill Wall and the section that joins Little Dingle Hill, which enabled the flooding of the Westwood, Dingle and Dunwich Marshes. The sluice at Walberswick was then reversed to contain the water and so flood an immense area of low-lying grazing marsh.

The mill was then redundant and was used for rifle practice until the west side was completely blown out, exposing internal woodwork. After the war there was a move to restore the mill and money was raised to repair the tower, reinstate the sails framework and repair the boatshaped cap.

Unfortunately, during the 1960s the mill was set on fire, leaving it in its present ruinous state. There was a move by Natural England to repair the mill brickwork, and a committee was formed to look at the possibility of repairing the brickwork and adding a lookout or observation point at the top; information boards showing the mill and its environs as well as the wild life were also proposed. This plan was well under way, but unfortunately Natural England had to reduce staff, so the scheme was shelved. **Philip Kett**
