## Lionlink (formerly called Eurolink) consultation day in Walberswick Saturday, 23 September 2023, 10am-4pm

Since last year's 'non-statutory consultation' on the proposed Eurolink multi-purpose interconnector cable project, including proposed landing sites in Walberswick and Southwold, it has been renamed Lionlink. Changes have also been made to the proposals for Southwold (a new cable route) and Walberswick (a new landing site), which has resulted in a new round of 'supplementary consultations' starting on 8 September. Following strenuous complaints by the Parish Council and others, there will now be a consultation day in Walberswick on 23 September in the Village Hall. This will give residents the opportunity to share their views on both the new and the original proposals. More details on these options will be made public when the formal consultation starts on 8 September.

Lionlink will be an important agenda item at the next Parish Council meeting on 11 September, which members of the public are encouraged to attend. Please put this date and 23 September in your diary and come along if you possibly can, as this is a significant way for us to demonstrate the sentiment of the village to this project.

#### **Environmental Update**

If you walked on the westerly part of the Common recently, the fantastic mosaic of gorse and heather will have caught your eye; this lowland heath has been monitored as part of Natural England's' Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty review. I'm sure they will have positive and useful feedback for us in due course.

The salt marsh behind the dunes is also to be monitored with botanists walking a transect to record vegetation on behalf of the Environment Agency, part of a nationwide salt marsh assessment. Again, their work will help to demonstrate the quality of land stewardship in the area.

Meanwhile on the wet grasslands, as viewed from the river Blyth path or the bird hide, the RSPB has put in a bid for land to become more user friendly for breeding waders. The outcome will be announced at the end of September.

Finally, the long awaited sluice in the reedbeds has been completed during a particularly forceful deluge of rain, getting the sluice off to a great start. The photo shows the replacement construction that will enable the water level in the reeds to be maintained more readily and hopefully add to creating the best environment for birds, including

### The kitchen & garden in September

Believe it or not, this is the time of year to start preparing for next years Horticultural Show. Even if you feel you are not green fingered enough or not capable enough in the kitchen, why not prove yourself wrong and give it a go?

This month your gardens, and your neighbours' gardens, will be full of seed heads from annuals like poppies, Love in a Mist and sweet peas.
