## The end of the organised Bonfire Night fireworks display

Inevitably, the changing times have meant the end of the village's Bonfire Night fireworks display, with the last display being held in 2019. Covid wiped out the next two years and last year escalating costs and lack of first aid support meant the event was cancelled. Walberswick is competing with large events in the area and we cannot attract companies to run our relatively modest display or to provide first aid cover without which our insurance is invalid. The cost of an organised display has become prohibitive with professionals saying it is not worth their while to put on a display for less than £4k. Even if these hurdles could be overcome, a new site would need to be found as the Cliff Field location is no longer available due to the Countryside Stewardship Agreement between Walberswick Common Lands Charity and Natural England.

While we are saddened by the demise of another village tradition, we would all like to give a massive thank you to Jon Winyard and his team, who have worked so hard over the years and overcome so many obstacles to make Bonfire Night such a fabulous and enjoyable event. #### November Kitchen and Garden

The Horticultural Show is a long way off but it is never too early to start preparing. Broad beans, onions, shallots and garlic are classes in the show and all can be planted now and then successionally sown in the spring and early summer. If you do this, not only should you have a nice early harvest in the spring but will have done a practise run for the show.

If you are a garlic lover, try growing garlic greens. Break up a bulb into cloves and plant three or four in a pot with compost. Put on a sunny window sill and water lightly. In 10-14 days the greens will be ready to cut. Plant successionally to get a continuous supply.

Marmalade is best made in January and February when Seville oranges are available. Start collecting jars now so you have plenty and can put aside a jar for the show. **The Horticultural Committee**

## Celebrating heritage, history and community

In September, for the first time Walberswick hosted two Heritage Days as part of England's largest community-led festival of history and culture. Unlocking the 2023 theme 'creativity unwrapped', St Andrew's Church organised a craft morning for children, encouraging them to create items inspired by our village environment using materials such as clay, beads, small coins, buttons, ceramic and tiles. Imaginative creations included rabbits, a butterfly, fish, a peacock, a brother and a car.

A week later, a specially devised Heritage Treasure map saw 30 adults and 24 children searching for treasure, following a trail of clues around the village and ending at the Heritage Hut, which hosted a display on the history of Walberswick. Emilie Dadswell created a colourful, interactive leaflet for the hunt, which was devised by Caroline Wright. Participants received a special Walberswick bookmark, designed by village artist, Helen Riches.
