Walberswick Common Lands Charity

February has been a very busy time on Walberswick Common Lands Charity land; harvesting on the reedbeds and conservation work on both the wet and dry heaths. The reedbeds are now recovering nicely and the sluice repair from last year, along with all this rain, means that the breeding seasons water level will be met sooner rather than later. The reed cutter normally takes around 3,000 sheafs to use for thatching from the harvest; this helps the area to provide more open water habitat for wildlife.

As the new Countryside Stewardship Agreement came into force on 1 January 2024, this winter was a good opportunity to extend conservation work on the Common. The strips of rotavated land which seemed to appear overnight are not 'Banksy' at work but the contractor replicating rabbit warren-style vegetation clearance to encourage the invertebrates and reptiles. Do take care walking dogs on the heath as the adders emerge from hibernation.

Summer exhibition in the Heritage Hut

When the Seas Come in' is the title of a pop-up exhibition to be held during the summer months in the Heritage Hut. Taking the Great East Coast Floods of 1953 as a starting point, the exhibition features paintings and images of the village before and after this and subsequent floods, and includes oral history and diary excerpts from villagers. It portrays more recent flooding, the greater impact along the coastline and questions how susceptible we still are to flooding.

Compiled by the Heritage Hut Team, with material kindly loaned from the Walberswick Local History Group and supported by the Walberswick Common Lands Charity, the exhibition includes activities for children. It will open on key dates for local schoolchildren by appointment, and will be included in the national Heritage Open Days event in September. Weekend opening times are 4–6 May, 15&16 June, 6&7 July and 3&4 August from 10am to 3.30pm. Further details will feature on the village website. **Caroline Wright**

As everyone will probably already be aware, LionLink developers have ignored virtually all the local responses put forward at the pre-consultation stage and, inexplicably, named Southwold/Reydon and Walberswick as their preferred potential sites for the cable landing. LionLink has now gone to the National Planning Inspectorate with an Environmental Impact Assessment document on which Walberswick Parish Council, amongst other local Councils, has been asked to comment. At its meeting on 18 March, the WPC delegated Clir Bassinette to lead on the response and the Council will be making its submission by 2 April. We are most grateful to the members of the WALL (Walberswick Against LionLink) group, who are helping with technical support and inputs. April Kitchen and Garden

The moment we've all been waiting for, longer days and brighter, warmer weather. The sowing season is now in full swing. Vegetables and flowers with categories in the show that can be sown inside include courgettes, French beans, runner beans, tomatoes, cucumbers and peas.

Many annuals such as cosmos, cleome, and nicotiana can be given a head start by sowing them in trays indoors and potting them on when they are large enough to handle. Outside, onion sets and early sowings of radish, spring onions, chard, shallots, garlic, mangetout and beetroot can be done. Flowers such as cornflowers, nigella, scabious and larkspur can be sown in gaps in borders. All make lovely cut flowers for the annuals category in the show. All plants can be bought as seedlings.

In the kitchen, why not make a 'starter' for a sourdough loaf, which is the bread category this year. It can be of any size, made with any type of flour, and with variations on the theme. Please look at the website for a simple 'starter' recipe.
