Margreet Walpole 1942-2024

Margreet Walpole has died in Dorset aged 82; she and her husband Nigel lived at Kermont (now renamed Margreet Cottage) here in Walberswick. They moved here in retirement in June 2002. From their arrival in the village they engaged fully in the life of the village. Margreet was a faithful helper at the Lunch Club which Brian and I were running at the time. She was often seen in the Village Hall kitchen at other events, cheerfully assisting at the British Legion Coffee Morning, the Village Fete, and the Cancer Research Coffee morning together with many other voluntary activities.

Margreet was kind, gentle, quiet and wise and had a talent for identifying those who may be lonely or unwell and was especially good at maintaining contact with anyone in residential care. She loved the village, her garden and her beautiful big dogs.

When the rigors of ageing became apparent, Margreet and Nigel moved to Dorset to be near their son in September 2021. Nigel reports that both he and Margreet remembered their time here with fondness, and gratitude for the kindness shown to them both whilst living here. **Christine Fisher**

Flagpole

The replacement of the village flagpole outside the village hall is now underway, following vehicle damage to the old one. The new one is being jointly funded by the village hall and the Parish Council and will now appear on the Parish Council asset register alongside other village amenities like benches, village signs and the scroll. The new base has been installed, so now we are just waiting for the flagpole itself. Unfortunately the one due for delivery to us was irreparably damaged at the suppliers by the recent high winds, so we now await a new delivery date.

Play equipment

The Parish Council is delighted to announce that the new 'birds nest' swing is now installed on the playing field and ready for use. The suggested suitable age range is three months to adult so there is no excuse for any of you not to try it out. There is now only one more piece of equipment to be installed, which is a see-saw due to be installed by mid-May.

Help save our local birdlife

Spring has arrived and with it many birds, such as skylarks, nightingales, bearded tits, sedge and reed warblers, which are now making their presence felt. However, please remember that this is the nesting season when birds and their young are very vulnerable to disturbance, especially by dogs. Specifically, you are reminded that with effect from 31 March there are national restrictions in place that require dogs to be kept on short leads when on open access land such as Walberswick Common. Restrictions also apply to the area that has been fenced off to the rear of the beach between Walberswick and Dunwich to protect birds such as Little Terns that nest in the shingle. Wild birds are under threat everywhere - please help us protect them. We thank all dog owners and others for their cooperation. David Pelly, WCLC Trustee

Shoreline Protection Area

Please help us protect ground-nesting birds and rare shingle plant communities from disturbance and trampling by not crossing the rope fence and keeping dogs under close control. This area will be temporarily fenced between April-September.















Temporary closure of harbour footpath - Walberswick side

Suffolk County Council have put up notices regarding the temporary closure of the footpath from near the Walberswick ferry hut to the Bailey Bridge to facilitate much needed repairs and resurfacing works. The closure will only be operative when contractors are on site and work is taking place. The path should be open on weekends and public holidays. May kitchen and garden

Only just over 11 weeks to go until the Horticultural and Culinary Show on Saturday, 20 July. Most of the fruit and vegetables with categories in the show should have had their first sowings. Seedlings that have been bought or grown will be ready to plant out as soon as the risk of frost has passed. Crops such as radishes, spring onions, beetroot, annual herbs and salads can all continue to be sown successionally.

Any annuals that have been sown directly into flower beds should be thinned out in order to give a better display. The early sowings of sweet peas may be ready to pick soon. To make sure you get a continuous display of flowers throughout the summer, roses, dahlias and sweet peas should be picked or dead headed regularly.

If you have any pelargoniums that you are potting on, make sure one is in a pot with maximum of a 30cm diameter ready for the Show.

On the culinary side of things, practice makes perfect so they say. Chocolate cake, sausage rolls, scones, savoury puff pastry tarts and sourdough bread could be among the categories to bake. Make and share with friends and family to get feedback (excuse the pun).

On the website for the month of May, we have gone through the schedule for the show and tried to expand and explain on the requirements for each category where we think it will help. Hopefully this will make the idea of entering, especially for the first time, far less daunting.
