Walberswick Remembered A Valuable Small Estate

In 1889, at an auction sale in Halesworth, William Howard purchased a 'valuable small estate' in Walberswick for £610. As well as a farmhouse, now called Old Farm, it had two fields to the south of The Street; Mill Field ran due south of the mill and Home Field was to the south of Old Farm. Howard was the founder of Howard Brothers, the family-run business that provided Elizabeth Jane Howard with the framework on which she created the Cazelet Chronicles novels. One of William Howard's brothers, Alexander, was the inspiration for the Brig in those stories.

William Howard came from a poor family but by the time he bought Old Farm he was a successful timber merchant. At 16 he had started working for a small timber yard on the banks of Bow Creek in east London. In 1876, having borrowed £1,500, he bought the business. As it expanded, his brothers joined him, and the firm took advantage of the high demand for timber in Britain and abroad.

At the auction sale the vendors of Old Farm were the executors of John Rimington; he had acquired it 32 years earlier. Some of the property was copyhold; the copyholder had ownership but only a copy of the deeds, the originals of which were held by the manor. A copyholder could transfer ownership but only with the consent of the lord and payment of a fine. Ten years after the auction sale William Howard was enfranchised and could then sell his land free of manorial obligations. There was just one problem; it was believed that John Rimington had been married, although there was no trace of the widow. William Howard had to accept the risk that she might appear and enter a claim for compensation with the manorial court. Fortunately for him, she never made an appearance.

Howard divided Mill and Home Fields, roughly six acres in total, into 13 building plots and began selling them in 1899. By 1903, six houses had been completed and by 1925 there were 12. The houses, designed by Frank Jennings were The Gazebo, Greyroof, Threeways and Far End (now Aldebaran). Seahome (now Mulberry House) was designed by TG Davidson, Mill Croft by WC Weymouth, and Shirley by Robert Stark Wilkinson. The architect of Lushan is not known; we know that Frank Jennings' associate, Raymond Johnson, was living there in 1904 but the form and details of the house convinced Bill Ungless that it was not by Jennings.
