
## **Walberswick Common Lands Charity**

What a real treat to be able to witness the incredible acrobatics of starlings here on our doorstep. These birds are on the red list, so an endangered species, but you wouldn't know it as thousands gather at the end of the day before funnelling down to roost as the light fades from the sky. A minor miracle, the murmuration remains a little-understood spectacle; hopefully one that continues to be visible here in Walberswick well into the New Year.

January and February will see plenty of winter maintenance work on the Common as access is improved and the contractors undertake annual developmental and maintenance work to maintain this special habitat. Removing gorse, bracken and birch is the backbone of this work, with a view to opening up the landscape to heather and grass and other flora to create a mosaic of vegetation by type and age to maximise its attractiveness to invertebrates and birds.

The reedbed over by the windpump is also being harvested to give some more open habitat space - variety being the key. Work is also underway to maintain and replace the picket fencing protecting the marram grass and dunes alongside the beach huts and coastal path. Please help us to keep these in good order - wild and natural.

## Parish Council Budget 2025/26

At the December meeting of the Parish Council, the final budget for 2025/26 was approved and this included a precept (the element of the annual Council Tax bill that goes to the Parish Council) of £20,000. The Parish Council is delighted to say that this is now the fifth year in a row that it has been able to approve a zero increase in the precept for Walberswick. For the 2025/26 year (based on the latest information from East Suffolk Council on how Council Tax will be charged in 2025/26), this will result in a charge of £36.19 for a Band D property, representing a 32.2% **reduction** on the Council Tax bills against the Parish element.

#### Public meeting 16 January 2025 – Proposed Article 4 direction in Walberswick

East Suffolk Council (ESC) is considering the introduction of an Article 4 direction in part of the Walberswick Conservation Area. An Article 4 direction means that planning permission is required for certain physical changes to single residential properties that would usually be permitted. ESC would like to invite residents to a public meeting to introduce the proposals and seek feedback. The public meeting will be held at 7pm on 16 January 2025 in Walberswick Village Hall and further details can be seen here: walberswick.onesuffolk.net/news-posts/news/view/825.

## **Defibrillator at the Co-op**

Following use of the defibrillator at the Co-op in recent months, there has been a question raised as to whether the current defibrillator can continue to be used. We are pleased to have obtained confirmation that the defibrillator has now been re-set and re-installed in its cabinet so is still currently available for use. However, it does appear to be coming to the end of its normal life, and the Parish Council is currently investigating ways to ensure that a replacement can be funded if it is needed.
