A love/hate relationship ignites between a small-town beauty (Aishwarya Rai) and a wealthy American (Martin Henderson) who is visiting her modest Indian village. In a swirl of music, dance, and comic misunderstandings, these opposites continue to attract and repel each other in a riotous romance.

Chadha transplants the traditional tale of manners to colourful India, infusing the story with the energy of some rousing dance numbers, bright saris, orange marigolds, magnificent elephants, and the stunning star, Aishwarya Rai herself.

PARISH COUNCIL MEETING 16 JANUARY 2012

Planning matters: Suffolk Coastal District Council has given permission for: the erection of a two storey extension at **Holly Cottage, The Street**; the erection of various extensions to house and garage at **South Close, Leveretts Lane**; the erection of various extensions, demolitions, removals and alterations at **Rosemary Cottage, The Street**; the erection of extensions at **3 Millstones, Millfield Road**. The Council raised no objection to the erection of an extension and minor alterations at **Redmay, Lodge Road**.

Financial Matters: The Council has received £2,600 in anonymous donations which have been paid into the Community Benefit Fund.

Complaints procedure: A procedure for dealing with complaints was adopted and will be placed on notice boards and the website.

Election to fill two Councillor vacancies: This was to have been held on 2 February following the request by 10 electors for an election. Unfortunately no-one was nominated to stand. It is important that people stand for election as the Council is prohibited from co-opting Councillors now the election request has been made. Notices of election will be erected soon after 2 February. There will be a very short time period in which to nominate someone or to seek nomination so please start thinking now if you would like to be nominated or start persuading someone you think would make a good Councillor. It is your opportunity to ensure that your views are represented on the Council.

A range of skills and experience is needed and the Council will need to balance the skills and experience of the existing Trustees with those of any applicant. An enthusiasm for the work of the Trust is a vitally important attribute. Anyone over the age of 18 may apply.

At the end of this February an important period in the Church's year, Lent, begins; a period that gives each of us an opportunity to reflect & deepen the spiritual side of our lives. Elsewhere on this page you will see reference to the first of this year's Lent Lectures, which may well give you an opportunity to do just that. For several years these lectures have been organized by the Sole Bay Team in conjunction with the local Methodist, Roman Catholic & United Reform churches.
