

# **Congratulations Ben**

Huge congratulations to Ben Rourke, who gained his commercial pilot's licence in July. A tremendous achievement and an inspiration to us all.

Ben, who has lived in the village since he was a young boy, has always had a passion for flying. His determination to become a pilot saw him join the Air Cadets for a short time, helping at the gliding club in return for flights, and taking lessons at Beccles Airfield, funded by working at the Anchor, developing websites and creating apps. All this while studying for A-Levels, blogging and writing a book about his experiences. In the face of fierce competition, Ben won a scholarship from the Honourable Company of Air Pilots, which enabled him to gain his private pilot's licence in 2017. After completing his A-Levels in 2018, Ben worked fulltime in digital marketing, while also working with his own freelance clients in the evenings and weekends, in order to fund the training for his Commercial Pilot's Licence.



Now, after three months of training at Perth Airport in Scotland, 14 theory exams, a five-hour night rating course, 150 hours of flight time and 75+ hours of coursework, Ben has successfully passed his dual UK CAA and EASA Commercial Pilot's Licence and is ready to apply for a job with commercial operators once he has completed a few short courses, such as multi-crew cooperation, which he will have done by mid-August. **Editor**

### **Environmental Report**

A number of people have noted that Natural England is reviewing its directions regarding dogs on the lead throughout August across the Suffolk AONB, including Walberswick Common. We are reminded that the current direction requires us to keep our dogs on a lead on the Common. A map can be found on the village website that indicates where this direction applies: tinyurl.com/2r2n6e3t. The purpose is to give rare nesting birds every chance to fledge late clusters, particularly nightjars, thereby supporting nature recovery and an increase in biodiversity.

The chestnut palings are being repaired along the inland side of the beach sand dunes. They help to anchor the sand and give the marram grass and other plants the chance to become established, so conserving the dunes. There has been notable success in restoring the dune ecosystem to the south of the main pathway from the Cliff carpark.

The heatwave, coming on top of a dry spring and early summer, is a reminder to take care that barbecues etc, do not cause wildfires as everything is tinder dry. **Vanessa Tucker, Environmental Stewardship Trustee**

### Walberswick Local History Group Meeting: The evolution of the Suffolk Coastline 1100 to 1600 Saturday, 17 September at 7pm in the Village Hall
